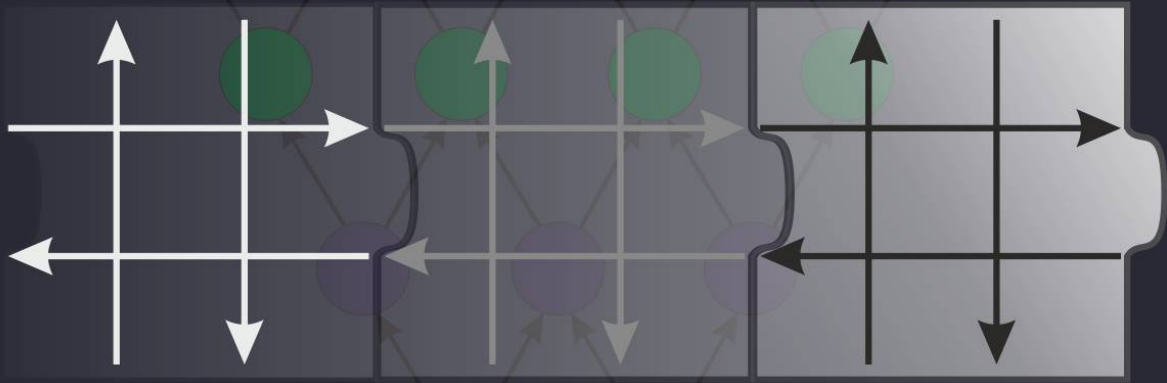

Acta logistica

Dear authors, readers, editors, reviewers and supporters of the journal Acta logistica (AL), for the journal, Acta logistica was the year 2022 significant and very successful. The journal Acta logistica was abstracted and indexed in the EBSCO and Web of Science (Clarivate) - Emerging Sources Citation Index databases.

What are the statistics about the journal for the year 2022?

- The journal Acta logistica published 48 reviewed articles.
- The review process did not accept 35 contributions.
- The number of contributions received in 2022 for the review process was 83.
- The number of authors and co-authors in published articles is 147 from 27 countries (Austria, Azerbaijan, China, Colombia, Czech Republic, Estonia, Finland, Georgia, Hungary, Indonesia, India, Iraq, Iran, Jordan, Morocco, Mexico, Malaysia, Poland, Russian Federation, South Africa, Slovak Republic, Syria, Thailand, Tunisia, Turkey, Ukraine, United Arab Emirates) and with many received citations.
- The number of reviewers for all contributions (published or rejected) is 56 from 18 countries (Austria, Cambodia, Colombia, Croatia, Czech Republic, Hungary, China, India, Malaysia, Mexico, Morocco, Poland, Russian Federation, Slovak Republic, Spain, Taiwan, Thailand, Ukraine).

In 2022, the journal Acta logistica recorded significant web visits and tracking within Europe and around the world. Based on an annual analysis in 2022, the journal has been watched in more than 109 countries worldwide. The average monthly page views of the journal AL www.actalogistica.eu site was 1 800; the average monthly visitors were 312, and the average monthly new visitors were 260.

All the papers from the year 2019 onwards are indexed in SCOPUS (Elsevier) scientific databases.

The journal Acta logistica is positioned as a Q3 journal according to data from Scimago Journal & Country Rank, based on Scopus bibliographic database for the year 2021. The SJR indicator is 0.240, and SJR measures the scientific influence of the average article in a journal. The SNIP indicator is 0.553, and SNIP measures actual citations received relative to citations expected for the serial's subject field. The CiteScore indicator is 1.3, and it measures average citations received per document published in the serial. Finally, the indicator Citations per document (2 years) is 1.153.

All the papers from the year 2020 onwards are indexed in Web of Science (Clarivate) - Emerging Sources Citation Index.
